

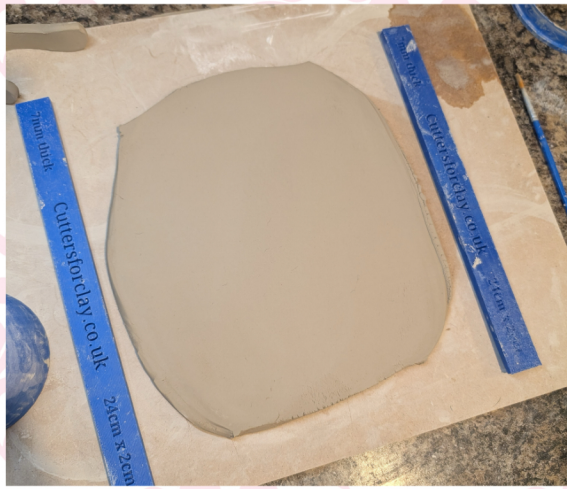

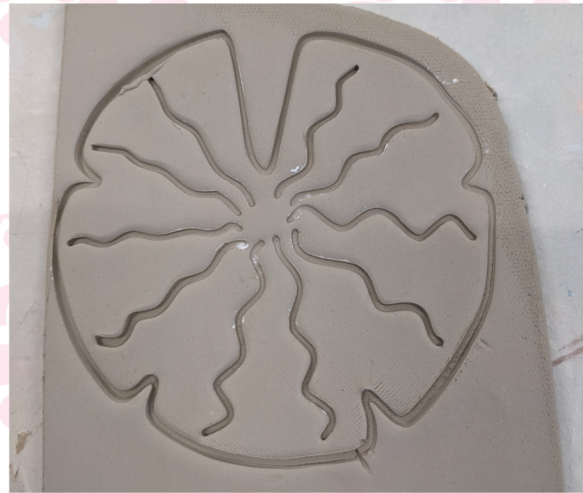
Cutters For Clay

1. Roll out your clay to 7mm thick. We've used our clay spacers to help



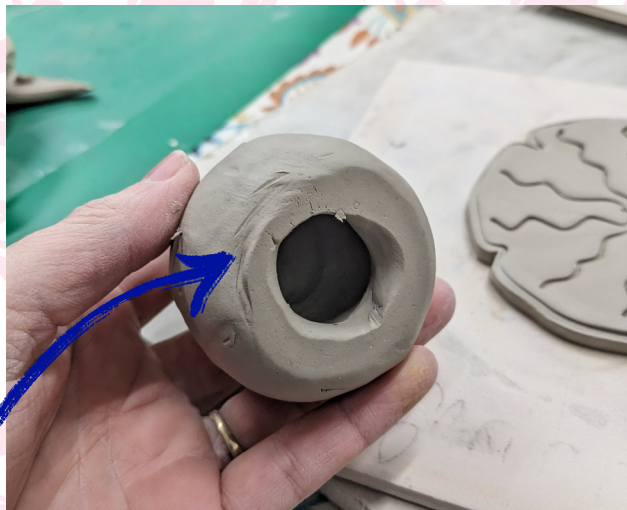
2. Dust your lily pad stamp with talc or corn flour and stamp into your clay



3. Dust your lily pad cutter and cut out around your stamped lily pad. Neaten up the edges with a needle tool



4. Make a ball of clay around the size of a tennis ball

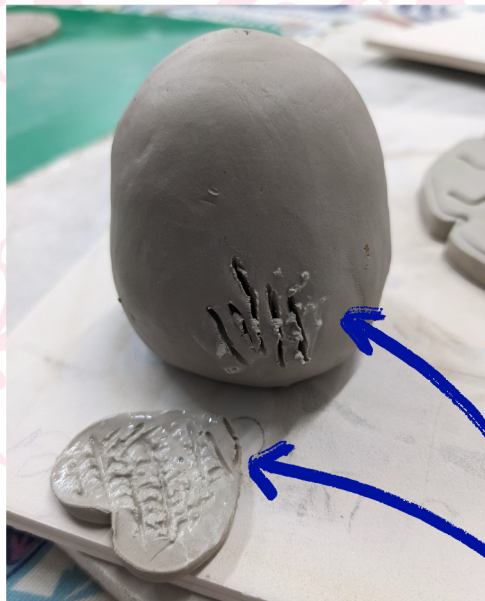


5. Make the ball of clay hollow, use a paintbrush to help and tap down onto the table to give it a flat bottom



6. Next cut out what will be your frogs tummy. Here we've used a heart but you can use whatever shape you fancy





7. Score and slip the tummy in place, close to the base of the body of your frog



8. Add whatever you'd like your frog to be holding...here we added a little toadstool



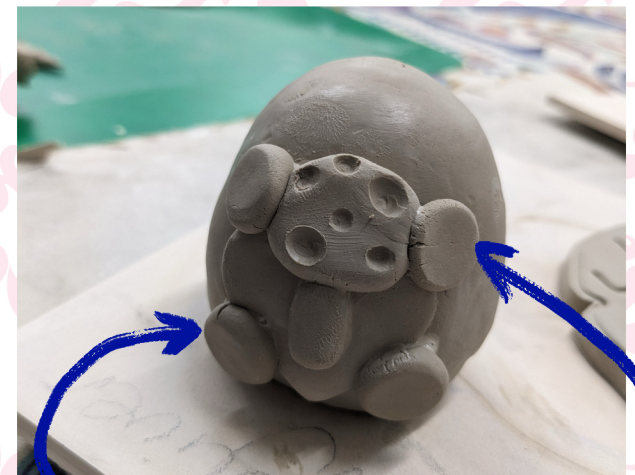
9. Add any details... Make sure to score and slip anything you add to your froggy friend



10. Make 4 pea sized balls of clay. These will be your frog's arms and legs

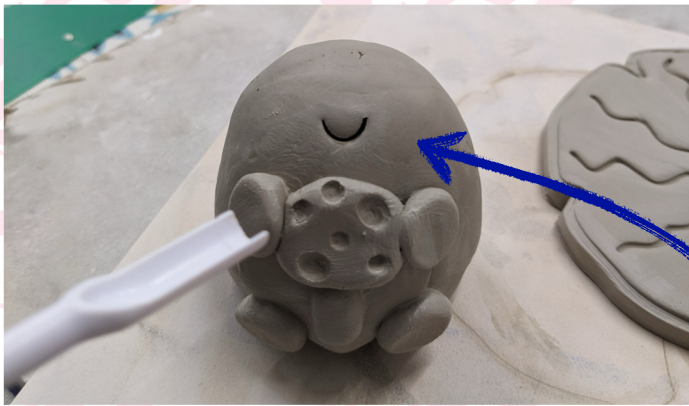


11. Gently flatten your balls of clay, score and add slip

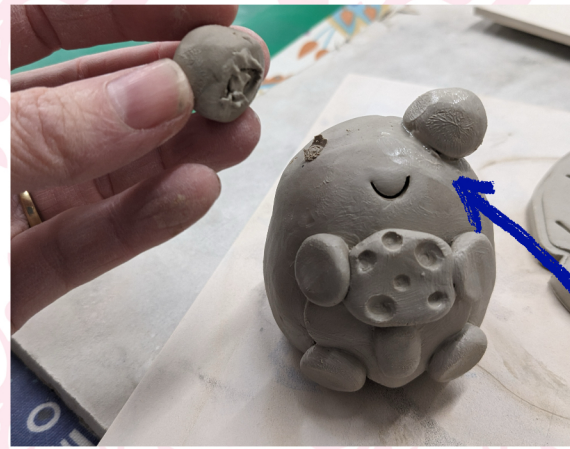


12. Score the 4 corners of the tummy where you will attach the arms and legs and firm into place





13. Give your frog a little smile! Make 2 balls of clay for the eyes and tap them lightly on the table to give them a flat bottom



14. Score the bottom of the eyes and the area you will attach them on the frog and paint on slip. Firm into place



15. Use the handle of a paintbrush or another tool to press into the eyes to make the pupils



16. Make a hole in the lily pad where you will add your frog, for air flow. Score and slip the base of your frog and the area around the hole you made and firm into place



17. We added 2 small flattened balls of clay to make cheeks! Add whatever details you'd like, just remember to score and slip anything you add. Have fun!
