




Make a Pansy with me...

Cutters For Clay




1. Roll out clay to 7mm thick - we use our handy clay spacers to help. Use the cutters to cut out your pansy pieces like this. You need 2 of the round petals




2. Gently pinch around all the petals pieces to give a more natural, organic look

3. Flip over one of the two rounded petals so you have a mirrored pair. Score the back of one and front of the other petal and paint on slip




4. Overlap the two petals and firm in place like this. Smooth the join with a damp paintbrush






5. Score the base where the 2 petals join and the back of the next petal layer like this. Paint on slip then firm in place.



6. Score the middle of this petal layer and the top bit of the back of the top petal. Paint on slip and firm in place



7. Roll out two small ovals of clay. Score, slip and firm in place. Use a damp paintbrush to smooth out the joints and edges. Shape the edges of you pansy as you wish



8. Leave your pansies to dry completely on a tile before firing
