Turtle Treasures Equipment List

- clay
- a pair of rolling spacers
- rolling pin
- needle tool
- cheese wire
- ball of clay to make a slip pot
- needle tool or pointed spatula
- small pot of water
- paint brushes
- foam sheet/board
- kitchen roll
- paint
- pallet
- silicone moulds
- turtle cutter
- turtle shell hump mould
- pot of baby powder
- fluffy brush





1. Your clay project station should be set up something like this...



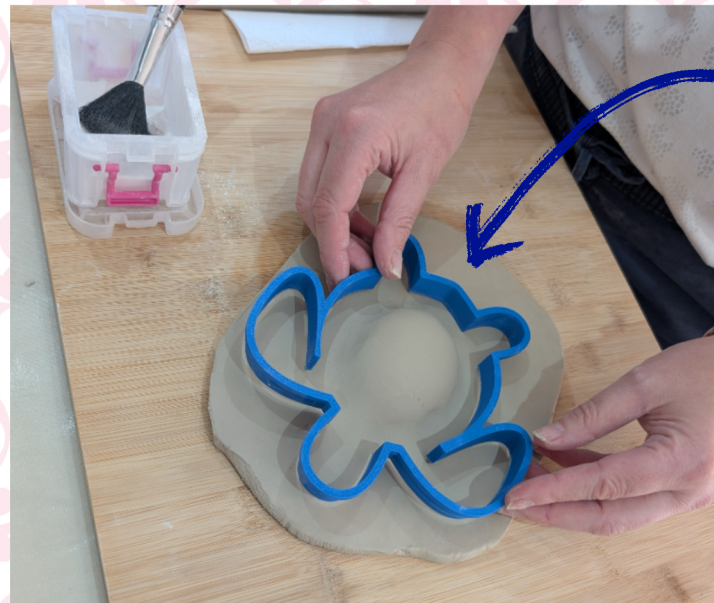
2. Use a fluffy brush to dust baby powder over the 7mm thick rolled out clay



3. Lay the clay over the shell hump mould, making sure the baby powder is face down to prevent the clay from sticking



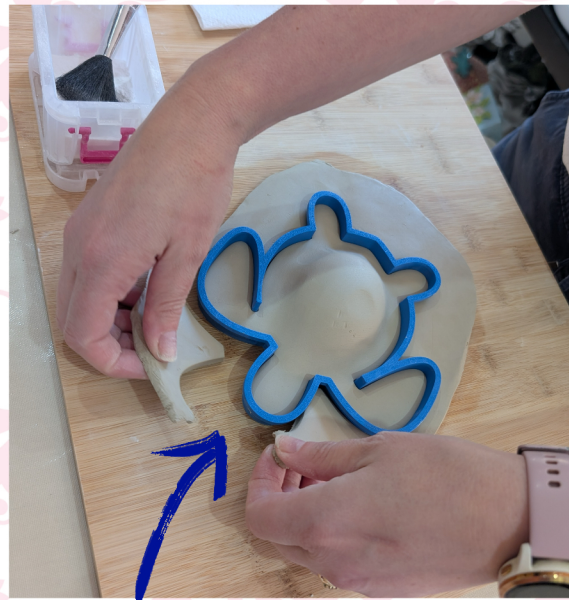
4. Use your hands to firm the clay around the shell hump mould



5. Leave the shell hump mould in place then line up the turtle cutter on top of the clay so the shell is centered



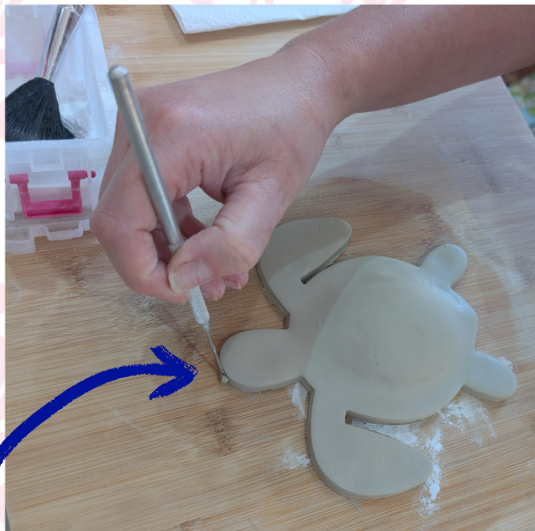
6. Press the cutter firmly into the clay



7. Leave the cutter in place and tear away the excess clay so you are left with just the turtle's body



8. Slowly lift the cutter and gently press down on the cut clay as you go. Leave the shell mould in place



9. Use a needle tool or pointed spatula to tidy up the edge of the turtle and remove any excess clay



10. Use some of the excess clay to make accessories to add to your turtle using our silicone moulds. Remember to score and slip everything you add to attach it firmly in place. Now all that's left to do is to paint your wonderful creation. Remove the shell mould at the end!
